

## Public Notice

City Corporation is a public water system subject to regulation under the federal Safe Drinking Water Act. Those regulations require the notification of customers whenever a violation occurs, and is the basis for this notification.

**The Arkansas Department of Health has advised City Corporation that there is NO immediate health risk from consuming the water. Failure to meet this requirement does not mean that the water is unsafe or that alternate sources of water should be used.**

The annual average of quarterly samples of the level of total trihalomethanes, a disinfection by-product, in the water exceeded the maximum contaminant level of 80 ppb (parts per billion) for the period from October 2025 through December 2025. The average level in your water for site #446YD016 this period was 86 ppb.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency sets national standards for drinking water and has established the maximum level for Total Trihalomethanes at 80 micrograms per liter. Trihalomethanes are a group of by-product chemicals which are formed by the use of chlorine in the treatment of drinking water. Disinfectants, such as chlorine, react with naturally occurring organic and inorganic matter present in water to form chemicals called disinfection by-products (DBPs). The EPA has determined that a number of DBPs are a health concern at certain levels of exposure.

Some people who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. The EPA has set standards to limit exposure to trihalomethanes, haloacetic acids, and other DBPs.

City Corporation has flushed the system, and have lowered the disinfectant residual levels at the Water Treatment plant. Further testing results have shown levels moving in the right direction for maintaining clean and safe drinking water to our customers.
